cannot think of any other community that has a grocery, a bakery, a pharmacy and a Post Office to serve them - we are the lucky ones.


Raj and Krishna have owned Londis for more than 25 years and most of the staff are long serving, are known to many of us and have become friends.

When we have events, Krishna always gives us donations and we have a special dispensation to advertise in the shop, which also sells our tickets and programmes.

The pharmacy orders prescriptions, makes them up and will deliver to those who need it. No more phoning the surgery, collecting the prescription and taking it to the pharmacy. It also provides inoculations and private consultations with the pharmacist - no more telling the chemist your symptoms in the hearing of strangers.



'Stop, Hang Up, CALL 159'

At the end of September 2021, we launched 159, a memorable short-code phone service that connects the vast majority of UK banking customers safely and securely with their bank when they receive an unexpected or suspicious call about a financial matter.

This breaks the scam 'journey' at the critical moment when you are at most risk of being manipulated into making a payment. So, even if scammers can make contact with you, that link will be broken by your call to 159, EDX before any information is shared. any payment is made, and any harm is done.



Stop, hang up and call 159 to speak directly to your bank. 159 works in the same way as 101 for the police or 111 for the NHS. It's the number you can trust to get you through to your bank, every time

159 will never call you. Only a fraudster will object to you calling 159.

Who can use 159? The cost of calling 159 will vary according to your phone provider. In many cases this will be the same as a national rate call. Please ask your provider for details.
